Part A - Reading Test (50 Marks)

Read the passage. Then answer the questions below (1-3):

Olympic Games are held every four years, with the Summer and Winter Games alternating, meaning they each occur every four years but two years apart. Their creation was inspired by the ancient Olympic Games, which were held in Olympia, Greece, from the 8th century BC to the 4th century AD. Athletics has been contested at every Summer Olympics since the birth of the Modern Olympic Movement at the 1896 Summer Olympics. There were many memorable moments and athletes so far.

The latest additions to this are Michael Phelps and Usain Bolt. Michael Fred Phelps was born on June 30, 1985 in Baltimore, Maryland. He is an American Swimmer and he holds world records in several events. Phelps won eight medals in 2004 Summer Olympics in Athens. Six of those were gold. These medals made him tie the record for medals in a single Olympics. In the 2012 Summer Olympics in London, Phelps won four gold medals and two silver medals. He has won 22 medals including 18 gold medals in three Olympics in a row that have made him the most successful athlete in the Games.

Usain St. Leo Bolt was born on 21 August, 1986. He is a Jamaican sprinter widely regarded the fastest man ever. He is the first man to hold both the 100 metres and 200 metres world records. He is the reigning Olympic champion in these three events, -the first man to win six Olympic gold medals in sprinting, and a five-time world champion. He was the first to achieve a "double double" by winning 100 m and 200 m titles at consecutive Olympics (2008 and 2012), and topped this through the first "double-triple" (including 4x100 m relays).

Both Usain Bolt and Michael Phelps are great world champions and deserve every gold medal and honour they've earned. However, if I were forced to choose between the two, I'd give US swimmer Michael Phelps an edge over Jamaican runner Usain Bolt.


